TH349 Emerging Process Spirituality

Bruce G. Epperly, 7:00pm-9:00pm Monday-Friday

This course explores the resources of process theology for 21st century spiritual formation. Process theology provides resources for transforming spiritual practices in dialogue with new spiritual movements, emerging Christianity, world religions, and postmodernism. This course asks the questions, "How do we transform spiritual practices, originated hundreds of years ago, so that they are relevant to pluralist, postmodern, and global communication culture? How do we practice sabbath in a nano-second culture?"

Bruce G. Epperly is the Director of Continuing Education and Professor of Practical Theology at Lancaster Theological Seminary and is co-pastor of the Disciples United Community Church in Lancaster, Pa.

Classes may be taken for 1 semester unit of academic credit or 1 advanced course of study credit through the Claremont School of Theology at the tuition rate of \$605 per unit (M.A., M.Div., Non-Degree), \$650 per unit (DMIN), \$865 per unit (Ph.D.) or \$200 per unit (advanced course of study). Deadline for Adding Courses in Summer:

All Students who wish to add a Summer course must do so by the first day of class.

Deadlines for Dropping Courses in Summer:

Classes that are 1 or 2 weeks long must be dropped by 2nd day of class. Classes that are 3 weeks long must be dropped by 5th day of class. Failure to drop a course by the deadline will result in a grade of "UW" for the class. A grade of "UW" will be calculated in the cumulative GPA as a grade of "F".

Admission to Claremont School of Theology

All students wishing to enroll in a Summer 2010 course for academic credit who have not previously enrolled at Claremont School of Theology and students who are registering for Advanced Course of Study credit must complete and submit a Non-degree Application for Admission no later than April 30, 2010.

Please note that students interested in applying for Advanced Course of Study credit will be required to provide proof of completion of a Bachelor of Arts degree.

Students who have been admitted to Claremont School of Theology for the Fall 2010 semester may register for the Summer 2010 without completing a Non-degree application.

Continuing Education Units:	\$65 per CEU
Advanced Course of Study:	\$200 per unit
Audit:	\$100 per unit

Full payment of tuition is due by the first day of class. A \$100 late payment fee will be charged to all students who have not paid their tuition and fees by the end of the first week of class for the Summer Session.

All Fees may be paid by cash, check or credit card (Visa and Mastercard).

Claremont School of Theology retains a security interest in all transcripts, diplomas, certificates, letters of recommendation, or grade reports, which shall not be released until all outstanding balances are paid in full.
